Teacher Development with No.1 Worldwide

We are proud to announce that we had some world-class professional development for our teachers prior to the start of the school year. The Institute of Education, part of University College London, sent two academics to MHIS to deliver a tailor made training session to all our teachers over the course of three days. The session focused on inquiry-centred thinking and language, play-based learning and literacy and high quality planning. Having such prestigious organisations deliver professional development to our staff will not only benefit our students greatly by enhanced practice in the classrooms, but was and will be a major factor in attracting the best possible teachers to our school.

Summer Works Update

Over the summer the Business and Operations team at MHIS were busy with a multitude of tasks, including:

- •Enhancing the outside space to include better drainage systems, safe surfaces under the climbing equipment, quality-tested and attractive running and cycling surfaces
- •Renovating all classrooms including those on the third floor for our K3, G1 and PE rooms
- •Installing the latest Promethean interactive whiteboards in the classrooms, along with iMacs, iPads and MacBooks in each class
- •Relocating the Admissions office
- •Enhancing the kitchen with additional new equipment
- •Procurement of toys, resources and equipment for all new classes

In addition, extensive discussions have taken place with our new UK Partnership school, including a visit to the school by the Principal and several Board-level online conferences.

The Grade I curriculum was a key focus, with careful alignment between our K₃ and Grade I expectations, integration of Chinese and Western approaches with a guiding hand from the UK curriculum, along with best practice from Canada and the IB programmes.

We hope students and parents will benefit from the different initiatives and actions that have been undertaken this summer.

Birthdays

Please note that our Birthday Policy at MHIS is that we celebrate all students' birthdays that occur when school is in session, with a focus on the child feeling special and acknowledging their birthday, while still allowing our class learning to be our key focus. As such, we sing Happy Birthday to each child in English and Chinese, offer them a special Birthday Hat or badge, and some classes may encourage children to make cards for them in our writing areas of the classroom as appropriate. If parents wish to bring in a cake to support the celebration, we request that you speak to your child's class teachers to decide upon an appropriate 15 minute slot during the day when you could come to class. We ask that only cupcakes or fruit portions are brought, rather than a large cake, as cupcakes are easy to distribute without causing much mess, stickiness and time spent cutting and serving. Thank you for helping us support our students' birthdays while still valuing in-class learning time.

Parent Communication

Apologies that it has taken us a few days to set up our communication systems between home and school, due to some technical hitches. Email is our first form of communication and we require parents to provide us with non-QQ email addresses - thanks to all of you who have done so. Teachers will be sending regular email updates to you so please do check these and reply as needed. WeChat is a secondary form of communication and is used by teachers to send last minute messages and updates.
