Parent Information Sessions



Many thanks to those K1 parents who attended the last, highly successful, Grade Level workshop which was related to 'Mark Making and Early Writing in the Early Years'.

The next session will be another of our Grade Level Specific Workshops, this time run by the K2 team. The focus of the sessions will be Phonics learning and Guided Reading for the grade:

Date: Thursday 12th January

Time: 8:45-9:45am

Location: Atrium

Teachers will be providing a general introduction to Phonics in K2 and focusing on Phase 2 to 3 (target areas for this grade level) including games, resources and ideas to try at home.

Following this, Guided Reading routines will be reviewed for both English and Chinese, with expectations shared for home and school learning.

If you plan to attend, please be sure to return your reply slip feedback to us by Tuesday morning at 9am.

Please note that, from Term 2, parent workshops will continue, with whole school topics being delivered by school leaders, and with Grade specific workshops being offered by class teachers, covering different areas to those offered thus far. If you have requests or suggestions for useful topics, please share with your child's teachers or Grade Level Leader.

End of Term Reports and Three-Way Conferences

Teachers are busily writing your child's end of Term report. These are structured by different learning areas and include teacher assessments about your child's achievement level as we reach the end of Term 1 through both tick list feedback and written comments for each area. Parents will be provided with hard copies of these reports prior to the Chinese New Year holiday.

Subsequently, there will be an opportunity for parents and students to meet with their child's class teachers at the end of the second week in Term 2. This meeting will be informed by the Term 1 reports and will provide the chance for the three parties to share reflections on successes so far, as well as to set targets as we move into the second half of the school year.

Government Inspection Part II

Following our successful first round of the government inspection before the holidays, we look forward to welcoming our Inspection Team back to BMH next week for the final and concluding part of this important assessment. Staff have been working hard on the governments advice from the last session, and continuing to offer the high quality provision for our students that so impressed them during their last visit. Health and Safety Inspection

BMH was also visited this week by another branch of the government, who focused on Health and Safety across the school in a rigorous assessment over the course of a morning. The Health and Safety inspection team agreed with our self-assessment of 90% excellence related to our practices, resources and campus and were very positive about the school's standards. They have offered two minor feedback points for us to follow up on and will visit us again next term to check all is still going well.
